

- 2. Athens While primarily known as a Greek city, it's mentioned in the New Testament (Acts 17:15).
- 3. Beulah Meaning "married" in Hebrew, symbolizing the land of Israel (Isaiah 62:4).
- 4. Bethany A village near Jerusalem, home of Mary, Martha, and Lazarus (John
- 5. Bethlehem The birthplace of Jesus (Matthew 2:1).
- 6. Bethel Meaning "House of God," where Jacob dreamt of a ladder reaching to heaven (Genesis 28:19).
- 7. Canaan The land promised to Abraham and his descendants (Genesis 12:5).
- 8. Corinth An ancient city in Greece, recipient of Paul's letters (1 Corinthians).
- 9. Damascus Where Paul experienced his conversion (Acts 9:3).
- 10. Egypt Significant in the story of Moses and the Exodus (Exodus 1:1).
- 11. Gethsemane The garden where Jesus prayed before his arrest (Matthew 26:36).
- 12. Goshen The region in Egypt where the Israelites settled (Genesis 47:27).
- 13. Hebron A city associated with Abraham and David (Genesis 13:18).
- 14. Jericho The city whose walls fell after Joshua's army marched around it (Joshua 6:20).
- 15. Jerusalem The holy city central to many biblical events.
- 16. Jordan Referring to the Jordan River, significant in many biblical narratives.
- 17. Lebanon Known for its cedars, often mentioned in the Bible (1 Kings 5:6).
- 18. Mount Nebo Where Moses viewed the Promised Land before his death (Deuteronomy 34:1).
- 19. Mount Olive Referring to the Mount of Olives, a significant location in Jesus' life (Luke 22:39).
- 20. Nimrod A mighty hunter and king mentioned in Genesis 10:9.
- 21. Palestine A term used in various contexts in the Bible.
- 22. Salem Meaning "peace," and associated with Melchizedek, king of Salem (Genesis 14:18).
- 23. Shiloh An ancient city and religious center (Joshua 18:1).
- 24. Siloam Springs Named after the Pool of Siloam in Jerusalem (John 9:7).
- 25. Smyrna One of the seven churches addressed in Revelation (Revelation 2:8).
- 26. Zion A term often used to refer to Jerusalem or the land of Israel.


