Let me ask you something, friend: is the Gospel still *good* news? In a world where cynicism is applauded and reverence is ridiculed, many are beginning to doubt whether the message of Jesus Christ is still relevant—let alone *true*. Some folks hear the "old, old story" and say, "That's just it—it's *old*." And to them, it sounds too good to be believed.

Recently, I came across a song by a band called *The Wonder Years*—and let me tell you, I was heartbroken. The song is titled, "*I Won't Say the Lord's Prayer*," and it may be one of the most bitter indictments of the Christian faith I've ever heard set to music. The singer defiantly declares—*twice*—"I refuse to live life on my knees." Over and over, he portrays Christians as backwards, dangerous, and irrelevant. And then the last line cuts deep: "*I don't need saving*."


Beloved, that's not just defiance—that's deception. That's a soul lost in the wilderness, building an altar to self rather than surrendering at the foot of the cross.


And yet, as a pastor, I don't find it in my heart to be angry. No, my heart breaks for them. Many who scorn the church have been wounded by it. And some of their criticisms? Well, sadly, they're not always wrong. As a wise old preacher once told me, "The church is the bride of Christ—but sometimes she can be a cruel mistress." We must be honest about our failures. We must echo the words of the Apostle Paul: "All have sinned and come short of the glory of God." That includes me. That includes you.

Here's the glory of the Gospel: Jesus didn't come for perfect people. He came for sinners. He came for the bruised, the broken, and yes—even the bitter. He didn't come to patch up your pride. He came to crucify it and give you a brand-new heart.

The truth may sting, but it will set you free (John 8:32). And the same Word that convicts us of sin also proclaims a mercy that is **new every morning**. The Gospel *is* still good news—because I still need it. Every day. Every hour. Every moment. And thank God, His faithfulness never runs dry.
