Seeing the Scriptures


“Blessed are you, when men hate you, and ostracize you, and

Ossuary of the Caiaphas family, from Jerusalem, 1st century AD:

Caiaphas was a leader of the persecution of the early church in Jerusalem, which eventually resulted in Christians being ostracized from mainstream Jewish society (Acts 4:6). This is not unlike the opposition which Jeremiah and other prophets encountered from the leaders of Israel in the Old Testament period. This bone box was photographed in the Israel Museum.



Statue of Elijah on Mount Carmel: The prophet Elijah was persecuted by King Ahab and Queen Jezebel (1 Kgs 17–19).



Jezebel seal, opal, 9th-8th century BC: Jezebel was a notorious persecutor of the prophets of the Lord. This seal dates to the period she lived in the northern kingdom, but cannot be positively identified with her. It was photographed in the Israel Museum.
